UTTAR PRADESH

Major Strategies:

- Ensuring Voter registration focusing on new voters
- Ensuring voter turnout on the day of election
- Training booth level workers to stop manipulation of votes or any other machinations

- Preventing Division of votes because of multiple candidates

1. MUZAFFARNAGAR



Rural voters in Muzaffarnagar parliament seat is approximately 1,145,696 which is around 67.7% as per 2011 Census. Urban voters at Muzaffarnagar parliament seat is approximately 546,617 which is around 32.3% as per 2011 Census

There are 40 Percent Muslims in this constituency and that is the most strong and also the weak point for the opposition. There are 5.5-6 Lakhs Muslims, 2.5 Lakhs Dalits, 2.25 Lakhs Jats, 2 lakh Saini and 2 lakh kashyaps.

2019- 70.7 % turnout, Sanjeev Balyan- 573,780, 49.5%, Ajeet Chaudhary- 567,254, 48.90%, Margin- 6526 votes. **There are a total 5 Assembly segments** in Muzaffarnagar. Budhana and Charthawan were won by Ajit Singh while the other three went for Sajeev Balyan of BJP. Budhana which has Muslim presence and strong RLD base won by Ajit Singh. On the other hand other seats like Khatauli and Sardhana which have strong Hindu jat Presence won by BJP. Muzaffarnagar assembly which is an urban seat was won by BJP.

2014- 69.7 % turnout, Sanjeev Balyan-653,391, 59%, Kadir Rana (BSP)- 252,241, 22.80%, Virender Singh (SP)-160,810, 14.5%, Margin- 36 % votes. 2009

2022- 3 out of the 5 assembly segments were won by the RLD-SP alliance and 2 were won by the BJP in 2022 state assembly elections. However, if we see Muzafarnagar district, there are 7 Assembly seats of which 5 were won by the RLD-SP alliance.

- Budhana with strong Muslim and Jat combination won by RLD
- Charthawan with strong Muslim and Jat support won by SP
- Muzaffarnagar, an urban seat was won by BJP
- Khatauli with strong Hindu jat base voted for BJP

- Sardhana too voted for the SP candidate.
- If we combine the total votes polled for BJP and SP-RLD alliance in all 5 assembly seats which makes the Muzaffarnagar Lok Sabha seat and compare their total votes, then the total votes for SP-RLD alliance is 524435 which is higher than the total votes 507630 of BJP, a margin of 16805 votes.

Current Political Scenario and challenges:

- Sanjeev Balyan is a strong candidate. He has emerged as the single most powerful Jat leader in BJP. He has defeated the RLD stalwart Ajit Chaudhary in the last Lok Sabha Election. There is political backing from the BJP, support from state machinery, money and also muscle power under his possession.
- From a professor to one of the most powerful leaders of the region, the journey began after the 2013 Muzaffarnagar violence. He has garnered support on the communal lines.
- Lower OBCs, upper caste Hindus and a section of Jats constitute his support base.
- To increase the vote base beyond Muslims is the biggest challenge for the opposition parties.
- Voters Turnout of Muzaffarnagar parliament seat in 2019 Parliament Election – 68%.
- Sanjeev Balyan has money, muscle power and state machinery that is a challenge.
- Dalit voters and lower OBC voters vote against the party that Jat supports. So we need to work on that. Dalit and lower caste communities are beneficiaries of government schemes.
- BJP has a strong voter base among Hindus in Urban areas.

- Youth and unemployment: Belt ki Norki is the dream of the youth in this region.

Strategy:

- 60-70 percent of jat voters will vote against BJP candidate Sanjeev Balyan.
 30 percent of Jat voters will vote based on personal connections and benefits from Sanjeev Balyan.

- Booth level strategy, stopping mock voting, safety of EVM, counting.
- Khaps and their support for the candidate.
- Meetings with different caste organizations in the society.

2. KARIANA



Assembly Seats within are **Nakur**, **Gangogh**, **Kairana**, **Thana Bhavan**, **Shamli** RURAL 76.08% URBAN 23.92%

SC 15.61%, 33% Muslims.

Total voters: 17 lakh

Muslims: 5.5 lakh, Dalit: 2 lakh, Backward Castes (Jat, Saini, Prajapati, Kashyap): 4 lakh, Gurjar: 1 lakh thirty thousand, Rajput: 75 thousand, Brahmin: 60 thousand, Vaishya: 55 thousand.

2019- 1666703 electors. Pradeep Kumar (BJP)-566961 votes, Tabassum Begum (SP)-474801 votes. Margin- 92160 votes. Harendra Singh Malik (Congress)-69, 355 votes. **BJP** was leading in **4** assembly segments (Gangoh , Kairana, Thana bhawan and Shamli) and **SP** was leading in **1** assembly segment (Nakur) .

2014- Total 1531767 elector, Vote polled-1119324. Hukum Singh (BJP)- 565909, Nahid Hasan (SP) 329081, Margin- 236828 votes.

2022: BJP was leading in 2 assembly segments (Nakur and Gangoh), RLD was leading in 2 assembly segments (Thana bhawan and Shamli) and SP was leading in 1 assembly segment (Kairana).

Challenges: Smaller OBC castes like the Sainis, who earlier used to be with Congress, aligned with the BJP. 2019- Voters Turnout – 70.7%, **Haji Fazlur Rehman (BSP),** 514,139, 41.70%, Raghav Lakhanpal (BJP)-491,722 (39.90%), Imran Masood-207,068 (16.80%). Margin-**22,417 (1.8%)**

2014- Electors: 16,08,833, Total Votes Polled: 11,94,308 (74.2%).

Raghav Lakhanpal (BJP)- 472,999 (40%), Imran Masood (INC)- 407,909 (34.20%), Jagdish Singh Rana (BSP)- 235,033 (19.70%), Shadan Masood-52,765 (4.40%), **Margin: 65,090 (5.5%)**

2022- BJP- 3, SP-2, division of votes between BSP and SP in Deoband, Rampur Maniharan (SC) seats. Shahranpur Nagar, an urban seat- Hindu polarization.

2022: BJP was leading in 3 assembly segments (Dhanaura (SC), Hasanpur and Garhmukteshwar) and SP was leading in 2 assembly segments (Naugawan sadat and Amroha).

Challenges: Amroha Seat is very suitable for defeating BJP in 2024 elections.

Muslims play a very significant role in this constituency. However they also need support from other communities to win the election.

Hindu polarization can make situations difficult for 2024 elections.

On the other hand, division of Muslim votes can also help the bjp candidate win the election

5. MEERUT

Rural voters-1,274,618 (76.8%), Urban voters-23.2%.

No. of Polling Booths - 1943.

Muslim-33.95%, SC-19.40%

There are 2.25 lakh Vaishya, Thakur 60 thousand, Brahmin 1.5 lakh, **Jat 1 lakh**, Gurjar 90 thousand, **Muslim 5.5 lakh**, **Dalit 3 lakh**, **Punjabi 50 thousand**, backward and others are about 4 lakh voters.

2019: Rajendra Agarwal (BJP)-586,184 (48.20%), Haji Mohammad Yaqub (BSP) 581,455 (47.80%), Harendra Agarwal (INC)- 33478 (2.80%), Margin- 4729 votes (0.40%).

- There are 5 assembly segments in the Meerut Lok Sabha seat. Out of 5, three were won by the BSP candidate while the other two were won by BJP.
- The winning margin in the urban assembly segment of Meerut Cantt was high for the BJP and that helped the BJP candidate win with a miniscule margin.
- At Hapur Constituency which has significant SC electorates 27 percent and 31 percent Muslim electorates. The Muslim and SC combined vote gave Haji Yaqub a lead in this assembly segment.
- On the other hand, Kithore has a significant Muslim population which helped the BSP candidate win this assembly segment.
- Again BSP candidate won the Meerut South segment with the help of Muslim votes.

2014: Rajendra Agarwal (BJP)-532,981 (47.90%), Mohd.Shahid Akhlak (BSP) -300,655 (27.00%), Shahid Manzoor (SP)-211,759 (19.00%), Nagma (INC)-42,911 (3.90%), mar-

gin-20.90 %.

 Three major parties fielded Muslim candidates. The total votes of these three Muslim candidates was 49.90 percent. Thus the division of Muslim votes helped BJP win with a big margin of 20.90 percent.

2022:

Three assembly seats were won by BJP and 2 went for the alliance. The Meerut Cantt seat clearly went for BJP with a margin of 1.20 lakhs, which indicates that BJP continues to keep its hold on the **urban Hindu votes**. Hapur and Meerut South were won by BJP with a thin margin. **BSP** played the spoiler role here and hurt the RLD/SP candidates.

Challenges: Urban Hindu voters support for BJP, Division of Muslim votes, Division of anti-BJP votes (dalits, jats and other communities).

BJP was leading in all 5 assembly segments under this constituency.

2022: BJP was leading in 4 assembly segments (Meerganj, Nawabganj, Bareilly and Bareilly Cantt.) and SP was leading in 1 assembly segment (Bhojipura).

- Youth and unemployment: Belt ki Norki is the dream of the youth in this region.

- directly hurt the youth. Agniveer affects most of the youth from all sections.
- Police and bureaucracy, law and order situation. Political leaders have become useless under Yoqi
- **SMALL INDUSTRIES**: The main challenges faced by the small industries are demonetization, the imposition of GST, the digitization of company papers and finally the COVID induced lockdown.
- The problem of waterlogging. Even with minor rains, drain water enters houses in many areas. Choked drains and broken roads have also become a menace for the people of the area.

Strategy:

- Increase Muslim voter registration
- Making Muslim come and vote like 2022 Assembly election
- Booth level strategy, stopping mock voting, safety of EVM, counting.
- Need to ensure no division of votes happens.
- To ensure that dalits also vote for the candidate, dalit votes in this constituency are 1.75 lakhs.
- The Kurmi vote, which is 3.5 lakh is second biggest after Muslims, which is 4.5 lakh. Santosh Kumar Gangwar got majority of Kurmi votes, along with other Hindu upper castes like Rajput (70,000), Brahmin (1 lakh), Vaishya (1.25 lakh), and OBC like Kashyap (1 lakh) and Maurya (1.25 lakh).

7. SHRAVASTI



Rural Voters- 93.6%

Muslim-34.83%, SC- 14.60%, Yadav-12-15%, Kurmi-20-25%

Number of Polling Booths - 2177

Voters Turnout 2019 - 52% (Very low)

2019- Ram Shiromani (BSP)-441,771 (44.30%), Daddan Mishra (BJP)-436,451 (43.80%), Dhirendra Pratap Singh (INC)-58,042 (1.30%), Nabban Khan (CPI)-12662 (1.30%), Marqin-5340 (0.5%).

BSP managed to win the seat because of the alliance with SP and there was no division of Muslim votes. However, the voting percentage was very low in this constituency.

2014: Daddan Mishra (BJP)- 345,964 (35.30%), Atiq Ahmad (SP)- 260,051 (26.50%), Lal Ji Verma (BSP)- 194,890 (19.90%), Rizwan Zaheer (Peace Party)- 101,817 (10.40%), Vinay Kumar Pandey (INC)-20,006 (2.00%). **Margin-9%.**

Division of votes.

2022: There are 5 assembly seats under this constituency. Three of them were won by the BJP and 2 were won by the SP. BSP became a spoiler for SP in Shrawasti where the BJP candidate defeated SP candidate with a thin margin. SP won Bhinga and Gainsari where Muslim voters are significant in numbers.

Challenges: Without the SC voters support, it's difficult to win this seat particularly when the SC voters have moved to BJP.

Voters don't come out to vote in this constituency.

Campaign Issues:

- Farmer's issue: Price of sugarcane, electricity bills, increased input cost in farming, MSP, Stray cattles, Farmer Sucide etc.
- Youth and unemployment: Belt ki Norki is the dream of the youth in this region.
 In the last few years, the State and Central government has made policies that directly hurt the youth. Agniveer affects most of the youth from all sections.
- This is one of the underdeveloped constituencies in UP. Development is a big issue. Roads, health, education and unemployment are big issues here.
- Shravasti 'tops' the list, with 74.38 per cent of the population deemed to be "multidimensionally poor", followed by neighboring Bahraich (71.88 per cent) in second position, and Balrampur (69.45 per cent) in fourth in the list of 101 Backward districts list of Niti Ayog.
- There are high illiteracy rates, malnutrition among children, substandard education facilities, absence of decent employment opportunities, decrepit infrastructure, and poor sanitation
- This region also has poor healthcare facilities. Shravasti, in fact, is the country's worst city in terms of healthcare facilities.
- This region has the smallest number of households with electricity, the largest number of households with no toilets and with no drainage.
- Flood is also one of the major issues faced by this region particularly in the Balrampur, Shrawasti and Gonda districts
- This region is not as rich as the western UP. Maize, sugarcane and paddy crops are the main crops in this region. But Flood situations every year cause low yielding from the fields.

Strategy:

- Voter turnout is low in this constituency (56%). Need to increase the voter turnout.
- Increase Muslim voter registration
- Making Muslim come and vote like 2022 Assembly election
- Booth level strategy, stopping mock voting, safety of EVM, counting.
- Need to ensure no division of votes happens.
- Muslim, yadav and SCs are a winning combination.

Party candidate Subrat Pathak stood second with total 469257 votes. He lost by 19907 votes.

In 2022, BJP won in Chhibramau, Tirwa, Kannauj (SC), Rasulabad (SC) and SP won in Bidhuna.

Yadav and Muslim are 4.5 lakh in total but the consolidated upper caste votes surpass that combination. One needs to rally other backward communities than Yadavs and Dalit votes.

In 2014, Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Babul Supriya Baral (Babul Supriyo) won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 419983 (28.58%) votes. All India Trinamool Congress candidate Dola Sen stood second with total 349503 (23.78%) votes. She lost by 70480 votes CPM's Bansha Gopal Chowdhury got 255829 (17.8%) votes.

In 2009, Communist Party Of India (Marxist) candidate Bansa Gopal Chowdhury won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 435161 (34.8%) votes. All India Trinamool Congress candidate Ghatak Moloy stood second with total 362205 votes

(28.98%). He lost by 72956 votes.

In 2021, BJP won in 2 assemblies, Asansol South and Kulti and TMC won in five assemblies.

• Asansol saw Hindu-Muslim riots in 2018, that led to polarization of the votes in 2019. The elected representative from BJP Babul Supriyo joined TMC in 2021. The Assembly elections in 2021 point to the dominance of TMC in most of the assembly seats. The Left and Congress have significantly lost grounds in this seat, since 2014. In this constituency, more than 50% are non-Bengali speaking people, a large section of whom are more inclined to support BJP. The Muslim voting turn out should be ensured and increased. Local strong leaders are preferred than outsiders as candidates. Non-Bengali candidates can actually be most viable. The stronger anti- BJP candidate seems to be from TMC.

2. ARAMBHAGH



(Haripal, Tarakeswar, Pursurah, Arambag (SC, Goghat (SC) Khanakul, Chandrakona (SC)

- Rural voters at ARAMBAG (SC) parliament seat is approximately 1,632,533 which is around 92.6%.
- Urban voters at ARAMBAG (SC) parliament seat is approximately 130,462 which is around 7.4% as per
- SC voters at ARAMBAG (SC) parliament seat is approximately 539,476 which is around 30.6%
- ST voters at ARAMBAG (SC) parliament seat is approximately 58,179 which is around 3.3%.
- MUSLIM voters at ARAMBAG (SC) parliament seat is approximately 293,087 which is around 16.6% as per voter list analysis

In 2019, TMC candidate Aparupa Poddar (Afrin Ali) won and became MP from this seat. She secured total 649929 (44.2%) votes. BJP candidate Tapan Kumar Ray stood second with total 648787 (44.1%) votes. He lost by 1142 votes.

In 2014, Aparupa Poddar (AFRIN ALI) 748,764 (55.0%) from TMC defeated Saktimohan Malik of CPM 401,919 (29.5%) Madhusudan Bag of BJP got 158,480 (11.6%)

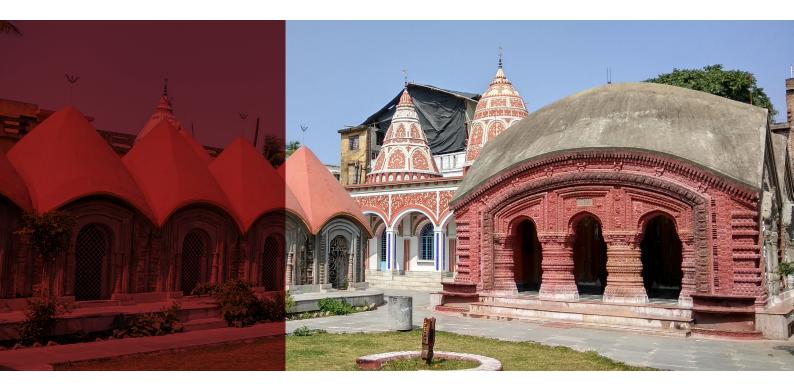
In 2009, Malik Sakti Mohan 630,254 (54.2%) of CPM defeated Sambhu Nath Malik 428,696 (36.8%) Indian National Congress and Murari Bera of BJP got 57,903 (5.0%)

In 2019, TMC won by a very slender margin of 1142 votes. What is notable is there were 20,495 votes polled for NOTA. If these votes can be identified boothwise, then specific outreach should be made to appeal to these voters to rally behind the strongest anti-fascist candidate. INC and CPM also polled over more than 1 lakh

25,000 votes separately. Some understanding should be struck between atleast TMC and Congress to prevent vote split. In 2014, CPM came second and BJP came third. There was a massive shift to BJP of CPM votes. This was a major bastion of CPM for a long time. Usually, Arambagh always witness victories by high margins. This was an exceptional election. If the left can mobilize its cadre back to its own fold, there is a chance of defeating BJP.

- Essential talking points: NRC/ CAA, Price Rise, communalism,
- Left plus congress can be an option in this constituency.

3. BAHARMPUR



(Burwan (SC), Kandi, Bharatpur, Rejinagar, Beldanga, Baharampur, Naoda)

In 2019, Indian National Congress candidate Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 591106 (45.43%) votes. All India Trinamool Congress candidate Apurba Sarkar (David) stood second with total 510410 (39.23%) votes. He lost by 80696 votes. Krishna Joyardar BJP got 143038 (10.99%).

In 2014, Indian National Congress candidate Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 583549 votes. All India Trinamool Congress candidate Indranil Sen stood second with total 226982 votes. He lost by 356567 votes.

In 2022 Assembly election, TMC won in six constituencies and BJP won in 1.

• INC candidate Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury has traditionally won from this seat. However, TMC dominated most seats in the assembly elections. But given the preference of voters to vote for Congress in the Parliament elections, and increasing anti-incumbency against TMC, it is advisable to back the congress candidate in this constituency.

4. BALURGHAT



(Itahar, Kushmandi (SC), Kumarganj, Balurghat , Tapan (ST) Gangarampur (SC) Harirampur)

- Rural voters at BALURGHAT parliament seat is approximately 1,276,796 which is around 89.3%.
- Urban voters at BALURGHAT parliament seat is approximately 152,987 which is around 10.7%

- ST voters at BALURGHAT parliament seat is approximately 218,757 which is around 15.3%.
- MUSLIM voters at BALURGHAT parliament seat is approximately 422,057 which is around 29.5% as per voter list analysis.

In 2019, Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Sukanta Majumdar won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 539317 (45.01%) votes. All India Trinamool Congress candidate Arpita Ghosh stood second with total 506024 (42.23%) votes. She lost by 33293 votes. Ranen Barman of Revolutionary Socialist Party got 72990 (6.09%).

In 2014, Balurghat parliamentary constituency had total 1254497 electors. Total number of valid vote was 1063053. All India Trinamool Congress can Balurghat candidate Arpita Ghosh won and became MP from this seat. She secured total 409641 votes. Revolutionary Socialist Party candidate Bimalendu Sarkar (bimal) stood second with total 302677 votes. He lost by 106964 votes.

In 2009, Balurghat parliamentary constituency had total 1010224 electors. Total

number of valid vote was 875360. Revolutionary Socialist Party candidate Prasanta Kumar Majumdar won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 388444 votes. All India Trinamool Congress candidate Biplab Mitra stood second with total 383339 votes. He lost by 5105 votes.

In 2022, 4 seats were won by TMC, 3 seats by BJP.

• BJP won in this constituency in 2019. The difference with the TMC candidate who came second was of little under 34,000 votes. However, the RSP and Congress candidate polled around 1 Lakh votes. Moreover, there were around ten candidates from smaller parties or as independents. Many of them drew the tribal votes, which is significantly high in this constituency. Such diversion of vote should be prevented. Turn out of Muslim voters should be increased. The strongest opposition party in this constituency is TMC.

5. BANGAON (SC)



(Kalyani (SC), Haringhata (SC), Bagdah (SC), Bongaon Uttar (SC), Bongaon Dakshin (SC), Gaighata (SC), Swarupnagar (SC)

- Rural voters at BANGAON (SC) parliament seat is approximately 1,293,520 which is around 76.1%.
- Urban voters at BANGAON (SC) parliament seat is approximately 406,243 which is around 23.9%.
- SC voters at BANGAON (SC) parliament seat is approximately 725,799 which is around 42.7%.
- ST voters at BANGAON (SC) parliament seat is approximately 47,593 which is around 2.8%.
- MUSLIM voters at BANGAON (SC) parliament seat is approximately 275,762 which is around 16.2% as per voter list

In 2019, Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Shantanu Thakur won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 687622 (48.81%) votes. All India Trinamool Congress candidate Mamata Thakur stood second with total 576028 (40.89%) votes. She lost by 111594 votes. Alakesh Das of Communist Party Of India (Marxist) got 90122 (6.4%).

In 2014, Bangaon parliamentary constituency had total 1540713 electors. Total number of valid vote was 1283688. All India Trinamool Congress candidate Kapil Krishna Thakur won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 551213 votes. Communist Party Of India (Marxist) candidate Debesh Das stood second with total 404612 votes. He lost by 146601 votes. K D Biswas of Bharatiya Janata Party got 244783 (15.8%).

All India Trinamool Congress candidate Gobinda Chandra Naskar won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 546596 votes. Communist Party Of India (Marxist) candidate Asim Bala stood second with total 453770 votes. He lost by 92826 votes.

In 2022 election, BJP won in 6 assemblies, whereas TMC won in just 1.

This is a constituency dominated by BJP. The Muslim turn out should be increased. Matua samaj vote should be targeted. Matua plus Muslims is a good combination. The Matua votes in last election had consolidated behind BJP, with the illusion of implementation of CAA. In this constituency, there is a support towards CAA, but opposes NRC. The non-implementation of CAA has resulted into discontent against Shantanu Thakur, the standing MP. The BJP has faired poorly in the Panchayat election 2023. The strongest opposition here is of TMC (so far).

Talking points: CAA/ NRC, how Modi played with Matua emotions. Proposed De-reservation of posts in UGC under this government. The dissolution of reservation and government jobs in center.

6. BARASAT



(Habra, Ashoknagar, Rajarhat new town, Bidhannagar, Madhyamgram, Barasat, Deganga)

- Rural voters at BARASAT parliament seat is approximately 607,467 which is around 35.4%
- Urban voters at BARASAT parliament seat is approximately 1,108,542 which is around 64.6%
- SC voters at BARASAT parliament seat is approximately 326,042 which is around 19%
- ST voters at BARASAT parliament seat is approximately 25,740 which is around 1.5%
- MUSLIM voters at BARASAT parliament seat is approximately 463,848 which is around 27% as per voter list analysis

In 2019, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Dr Kakoli Ghoshdastidar won and became MP from this seat. She secured total 648444 votes. (46.44%) Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Mrinal Kanti Debnath stood second with total 538275 votes. He lost by 110169 (38.55%) votes. Haripada Biswas of All India Forward Block 124068 (8.89%) votes.

In 2014, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Dr Kakali Ghoshdostidar won and became MP from this seat. She secured total 525387 (34.73%) votes. All India Forward Bloc candidate Dr Mortoza Hossain stood second with total 352246 (23.28%) votes. He lost by 173141 votes. P C Sorcar Junior of Bharatiya Janata Party got 296608 (19.61%).

In 2009, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Kakali Ghosh Dastidar won and became MP from this seat. She secured total 522530 votes. All India Forward Bloc candidate Sudin Chattopadhyay stood second with total 399629 votes. He lost by 122901 votes. Bratin Sengupta Bharatiya Janata Party 55353 (4.51%).

In 2022, TMC won in all 7 constituencies. In 2019, AITC was leading in 5 assembly segments (Ashoknagar, Rajarhat new town, Madhyamgram, Barasat and Deganga) and BJP was leading in 2 assembly segments (Habra and Bidhannagar).

This constituency is a TMC stronghold since 2009. The assembly segments also saw TMC lead in every constituency in 2021. TMC is strongest option against BJP here and should be backed.

7. BARDHAMAN DURGAPUR



(Bardhaman Dakshin, Monteswar, Bardhaman Uttar (SC), Bhatar, Galsi (SC), Durgapur Purba, Durgapur paschim)

- Rural voters at BARDHAMAN-DURGAPUR parliament seat is approximately 937,245 which is around 54.1%
- Urban voters at BARDHAMAN-DURGAPUR parliament seat is approximately 795,186 which is around 45.9%

- MUSLIM voters at BARDHAMAN-DURGAPUR parliament seat is approximately 318,255 which is around 18.4% as per voter list

In 2019, Bardhaman Durgapur parliamentary constituency had total 1733578 electors. Total number of valid vote was 1433007. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate SS Ahluwalia won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 598376 votes. All India Trinamool Congress candidate Dr Mamtaz Sanghamita stood second with total 595937 votes. She lost by 2439 votes. Abhas Ray Chaudhuri from Communist Party Of India (Marxist) got 161329 (11.26%).

The BJP won in this constituency by a slender margin of under 2500 votes in 2019. The Left and Congress candidates separately however, polled near 2 lakh votes. In 2014, BJP had come third and Left came second. The victory of BJP was possible because of a substantial shift of Left votes to BJP. In the assembly elections, TMC

recovered grounds in the Assembly election of 2021. In the Panchayat elections however, it was observed that Left has recovered a lot of grounds and the vote base that had shifted to BJP seems to have returned to the left fold. In almost all 17 Zilla Parishads the Left had more votes than BJP. This can help the TMC because it points at reduction of BJP votes. There shouldn't be candidate from TMC-Left and Congress. The backing of the candidate should be carefully decided. The dalit votes are high in the constituency although it's a general constituency. The possible candidates to be backed can be TMC or Left/Congress depending on the candidate.

8. BARDHAMAN PURBA



(Raina (SC), Jamalpur (SC), Kalna (SC), Memari, Purbasthali Dakshin, Purbasthali Uttar, Katwa)

- Rural voters at BARDHAMAN PURBA (SC) parliament seat is approximately 1,450,531 which is around 85.5%.
- Urban voters at BARDHAMAN PURBA (SC) parliament seat is approximately 245,997 which is around 14.5%
- SC voters at BARDHAMAN PURBA (SC) parliament seat is approximately 529,317 which is around 31.2% as per 2011 Census.
- ST voters at BARDHAMAN PURBA (SC) parliament seat is approximately 137,419 which is around 8.1% as per 2011 Census.
- MUSLIM voters at BARDHAMAN PURBA (SC) parliament seat is approximately 375,573 which is around 22.1%

In 2019, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Sunil Kumar Mondal won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 640834 (44.51%) votes. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Paresh Chandra Das stood second with total 551523 (38.31%) votes. He lost by 89311 votes. Iswar Chandra Das of Communist Party Of India (marxist) got 175920 (12.22%).

All India Trinamool Congress candidate Sunil Kumar Mondal won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 574560 votes. Communist Party Of India (marxist) candidate Iswar Chandra Das stood second with total 460181 votes. He lost by 114379 votes. Santosh Roy of Bharatiya Janata Party got 170828 (11.15%).

In 2009, Communist Party Of India (marxist) candidate Anup Kumar Saha won and

became MP from this seat. He secured total 531987 votes. All India Trinamool Congress candidate Ashoke Biswas stood second with total 472568 votes. He lost by 59419 votes.

In 2022, Assembly election TMC won in all 7 constituencies.

 In Purba Bardhaman the TMC had a decisive victory in 2019, over BJP. This happened despite significant vote of the left shifting to BJP. Although in Panchayat elections the left and Congress had performed well, the strongest party is still the TMC. It will depend on the candidate.

9. BASIRHAT



(Baduria, Haroa, Minakhan (SC), Sandeshkhali (ST), Basirhat Dakshin, Basirhat Uttar, Hingalganj (SC))

In 2019, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Nusrat Jahan Ruhi won and became MP from this seat. She secured total 782078 (54.55%) votes. In 2014, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Idris Ali won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 492326 votes. Communist Party Of India candidate Nurul Huda stood second with total 382667 votes. He lost by 109659 votes. Samik Bhattacharya of BJP 233887 got (15.69%).

In 2009, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Sk Nurul Islam won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 479650 votes. Communist Party Of India candi-

date Ajay Chakraborty stood second with total 419267 votes. He lost by 60383 votes.

- In 2021, TMC won in all 7 assembly constituencies.
- There is a pattern of fielding multiple Muslim candidates in this constituency. Splitting of Muslim votes should be avoided here. The strongest party here is the TMC.

• If RG comes and campaigns Congress can win this.

10. BOLPUR



(Ketugram, Mangalkot, Ausgram (SC), Bolpur, Nanoor (SC), Labhpur, Mayureswar)

- Rural voters at BOLPUR (SC) parliament seat is approximately 1,572,986 which is around 92.4%
- Urban voters at BOLPUR (SC) parliament seat is approximately 129,380 which is around 7.6%
- SC voters at BOLPUR (SC) parliament seat is approximately 534,543 which is around 31.4% as per 2011 Census.
- ST voters at BOLPUR (SC) parliament seat is approximately 119,166 which is around 7% as per 2011 Census.
- MUSLIM voters at BOLPUR (SC) parliament seat is approximately 499,110 which is around 29.3% as per voter list analysis.

In 2019, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Asit Kumar Mal won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 699171 (47.83%) votes. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Das Ramprasad stood second with total 592769 votes (40.55%). He lost by 106402 votes. CPM candidate Ram Chandra Dom got 91964 (6.2%).

In 2014, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Anupam Hazra won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 630693 (41%) votes. Communist Party Of India (Marxist) candidate Dome Ramchandra stood second with total 394581(25.68%) votes. He lost by 236112 votes. BJP got 12%.

In 2009, Communist Party Of India (marxist) candidate Doctor Ram Chandra Dome won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 538383 (41.17%) votes. Indian National Congress candidate Asit Kumar Mal stood second with total 411501 (31.4%)

votes. He lost by 126882 votes. BJP got 5.3% votes. In 2021, TMC won all the seven assembly seats.

This was a CPM stronghold till 2009. But since 2014, this has become a TMC stronghold. In the Panchayat elections too TMC managed more than 62% votes, followed by BJP which had 19% votes. In 2019 too, TMC had a lead of over one lakh vote. TMC is so far the strongest opposition party in this constituency and should be backed.

11. COOCH BEHAR(SC)

- MUSLIM voters at Cooch Behar (SC) parliament seat is approximately 476,207 which is around 26.3% as per voter list analysis

In 2019, Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Nisith Pramanik won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 731594 (47.96%) votes. All India Trinamool Congress candidate Adhikary Paresh Chandra stood second with total 677363 (44.4% votes). He lost by 54231 votes. AIFB and Congress were as low as 3% and 1.8%.

In All India Trinamool Congress candidate Renuka Sinha won and became MP from this seat. She secured total 526499 votes. All India Forward Bloc candidate Dipak Kumar Roy stood second with total 439392 votes. He lost by 87107 votes. BJP got 13.4% vote.

In 2014, Nripendra Nath Roy of AIFB won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 500677 votes. All India Trinamool Congress candidate Arghya Roy Prad-

han stood second with total 466928 votes. He lost by 33749 votes.

In 2021, BJP won six out of seven assemblies. TMC won in 1, which is Sitai.

The BJP has rose in power in this particular constituency. Nishith Ranjan Pramanik won with almost 55,000 votes. In the Assembly elections too, out of 7 assembly seats, BJP won in 6. The TMC however, has regained some grounds by Panchayat elections 2023. In the assembly constituency of Sitai, which is Muslim concentrated, TMC won in 2021. In Panchayat too, in Sitai TMC had more than 80% votes. BJP got 32% votes in Panchayat which is significant decline from its 2019 vote share. STRONGEST and ONLY opposition here is TMC. The turnout of Muslims should be increased in this constituency for Parliament election.

12. DIAMOND HARBOUR



(Diamond harbour , Falta, Satgachia, Bishnupur (SC), Maheshtala, Budge Budge, Metiaburuz)

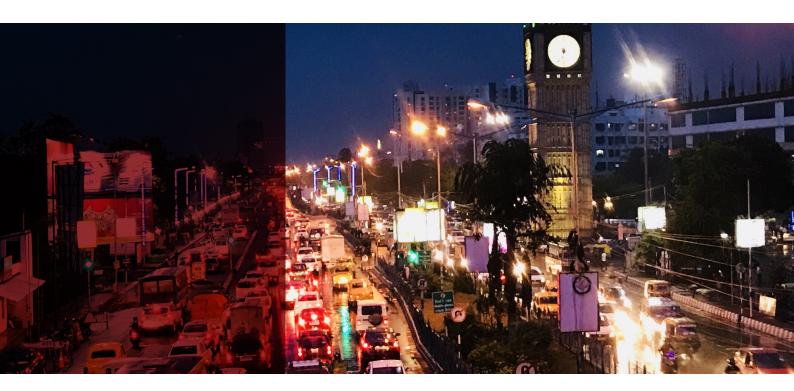

All India Trinamool Congress candidate Sougata Ray won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 512062 (42.51%) votes. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Samik Bhattacharya stood second with total 459060 (38.11%) votes. He lost by 53002 votes. The CPM candidate got 13.9% votes.

In 2014, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Saugata Roy won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 483244 votes. Communist Party Of India (marxist) candidate Asim Kumar Dasgupta stood second with total 328310 votes. He lost by 154934 votes. The BJP candidate got 18% votes.

All India Trinamool Congress candidate Sougata Ray won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 458988 votes. Communist Party Of India (marxist) candidate Amitava Nandy stood second with total 438510 votes. He lost by 20478 votes.

BJP got 4.5% votes.

In 20221, TMC won all seven constituencies.

Dumdum used to be a left bastion but since 2009 has turned towards TMC.
 TMC is right now the strongest opposition in this constituency.

14. HOWRAH



(Bally, Howrah Uttar, Howrah Madhya, Shibpur, Howrah Dakshin, Sankrail (SC), Panchla)

- Rural voters at HOWRAH parliament seat is approximately 117,590 which is around 7.2%.
- Urban voters at HOWRAH parliament seat is approximately 1,515,611 which is around 92.8%
- SC voters at HOWRAH parliament seat is approximately 150,254 which is around 9.2%.
- MUSLIM voters at HOWRAH parliament seat is approximately 358,381 which is around 21.9%

In 2019, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Prasun Banerjee won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 576711 (47.17%) votes. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Rantidev Sengupta stood second with total 473016 (38.69%) votes. He lost by 103695 votes. CPM candidate got 8.63%.

In 2014, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Prasun Banerjee won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 488461(32.45%) votes. Communist Party Of India (Marxist) candidate Sridip Bhattacharya stood second with total 291505 (19.37%) votes. He lost by 196956 votes. BJP got 16.49% Votes.

All India Trinamool Congress candidate Ambica Banerjee won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 477449 (35.5%) votes. Communist Party Of India (Marxist) candidate Swadesh Chakrabortty (32.7%) stood second with total 440057

votes. He lost by 37392 votes

In 2021 Assembly elections, TMC won in all seven constituencies.

• The TMC has stronghold in Howrah since 2009. However, BJP is also significantly making its presence felt. There has been regular communal riots and polarization in votes are expected. The TMC performed well in the Assembly elections of 2021 by winning in all the Assembly segments and also in the Panchayat elections of 2023. TMC is the strongest opposition here against BJP and should be backed. The Muslim vote must be ensured and consolidated. Division of vote is a possibility here, that needs to be avoided.

- MUSLIM voters at JADAVPUR parliament seat is approximately 388,489 which is around 21.4% as per voter list analysis

In 2019, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Mimi Chakraborty won and became MP from this seat. She secured total 688472 (47.9%) votes. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Anupam Hazra stood second with total 393233 (27%) votes. He lost by 295239 votes. Bikash Ranjan Bhattacharya of CPIM got 302264 (21%) votes.

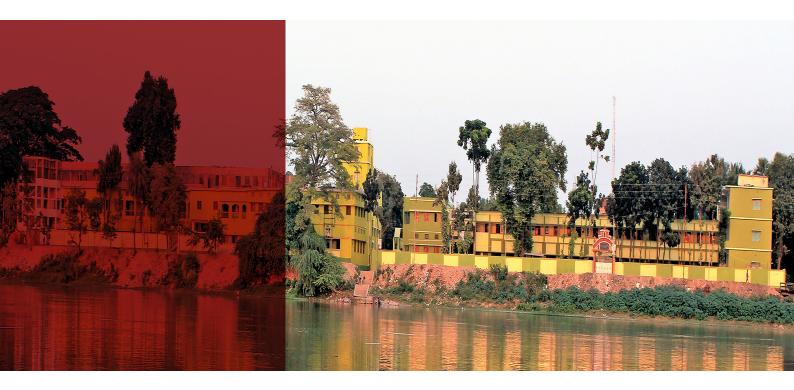
In 2014, Sugata Bose of All India Trinamool Congress won with 584244 (36.61%) defeating Sujan Chakraborty of Communist Party Of India (marxist) who got 459041 (28.77%)

In 2009 All India Trinamool Congress candidate Kabir Suman won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 540667 votes. Communist Party Of India (Marxist) candidate Sujan Chakraborty stood second with total 484400 votes. He lost by 56267 votes.

In 2021 Assembly elections, TMC won in five and ISF and Left alliance won in Bhangar.

• The Jadavpur constituency is precarious. While TMC has stronghold in atleast three out of six assembly segments (Tollygunge, Sonarpur Uttor and Sonarpur Dakshin), the Left and ISF has significant stronghold in Bhangar, Jadavpur and Baruipur Pashchim. The BJP also performed well in the Panchayat election. If the Left fields a strong woman candidate, there is chance of consolidation. The TMC still is relatively stronger force, but the support around a candidate should be done depending on the candidate.

16. JANGIPUR

- ST voters at JANGIPUR parliament seat is approximately 32,282 which is around 2%.
- MUSLIM voters at JANGIPUR parliament seat is approximately 1,020,797 which is around 63.2% as per voter list analysis.

All India Trinamool Congress candidate Khalilur Rahaman won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 562838 (43.14%) votes. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Mafuja Khatun stood second with total 317056 (24.3%) votes. She lost by 245782 votes. Abhijit Mukherjee of Indian National Congress got 255836 (19.61%) votes

Indian National Congress candidate Abhijit Mukherjee won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 378201 votes. Communist Party Of India (Marxist) candidate Muzaffar Hossain stood second with total 370040 votes. He lost by 8161 votes. Sk Nurul Islam of All India Trinamool Congress got 207455 (14.91%) votes.

Indian National Congress candidate Pranab Mukherjee won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 506749 votes. Communist Party Of India (marxist) candi-

date Mriganka Sekhar Bhattacharya stood second with total 378600 votes. He lost by 128149 votes.

• This constituency is a traditional Congress seat. Abhijit Mukherjee won the elections in 2014. TMC won in 2019 and Abhijit Mukherjee from Congress came third. However, there was a religious polarization. The revival of Congress in Panchayat elections points towards votes turning here once again. Congress can emerge as the strongest opposition, if it fields a local Muslim grounded leader. The Muslim vote make all the difference in this constituency. Whoever the Muslim votes back, they are bound to win. However, one needs to be guarded against division of Muslim votes, leading into religious polarization towards BJP.

17. JAYNAGAR (SC)



Gosaba (SC), Basanti (SC), Kultali (SC), Jaynagar (SC), Canning paschim (SC), Canning Purba, Magrahat Purba (SC)

- Rural voters at JAYNAGAR (SC) parliament seat is approximately 1,415,428 which is around 85.9%.
- Urban voters at JAYNAGAR (SC) parliament seat is approximately 232,334 which is around 14.1%
- SC voters at JAYNAGAR (SC) parliament seat is approximately 631,093 which is around 38.3%
- ST voters at JAYNAGAR (SC) parliament seat is approximately 52,728 which is around 3.2%
- MUSLIM voters at JAYNAGAR (SC) parliament seat is approximately 589,294 which is around 35.8% as per voter list analysis.

In 2019, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Pratima Mondal won and became MP from this seat. She secured total 761202 (56.12%) votes. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Dr Ashok Kandary stood second with total 444427 votes. He lost by 316775 votes. Subhash Nashkar from RSP got 5.01%.

In 2014, Pratima Mondal of TMC got 494,746 (41.7%) defeating Subhas Naskar 386,362 (32.6%) from Revolutionary Socialist Party. Dr. Tarun Mandal of Socialist Unity Centre Of India (COMMUNIST) got 117,454 (9.9%) and Krishnapada Majumder got 113,206 (9.5%) Bharatiya Janta Party

In 2021 Assembly election TMC won in all six constituencies.

• TMC is the strongest opposition in this constituency and has been the dominant force. Earlier this used to be a stronghold of RSP, but from 2009 TMC started to win. In 2014, BJP came fourth in this constituency. However, the vote-base of RSP shifted to BJP. TMC are most likely to defeat BJP and should be backed. There is a chance of substantial dalit votes shifting to BJP, hence Muslim turn out must be ensured and consolidated behind one candidate. Its better to field a local grounded SC leader.

18. KOLKATA DAKSHIN



Kasba, Behala Purba, Behala Paschim, Kolkata port, Bhabanipur, Rashbehari, Ballygunge

- Urban voters at KOLKATA DAKSHIN parliament seat is approximately 1,700,607 which is around 98.4%.
- SC voters at KOLKATA DAKSHIN parliament seat is approximately 101,967 which is around 5.9%
- ST voters at KOLKATA DAKSHIN parliament seat is approximately 5,185 which is around 0.3%
- MUSLIM voters at KOLKATA DAKSHIN parliament seat is approximately 380,163 which is around 22% as per voter list analysis.

All India Trinamool Congress candidate Mala Roy won and became MP from this seat. She secured total 573119 (47.48%) votes. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Chandra Kumar Bose stood second with total 417927 votes. He lost by 155192 votes. AITC was leading in 6 assembly segments (Kasba, Behala Purba, Behala paschim, Kolkata port, Bhabanipur and Ballygunge) and BJP was leading in 1 assembly segment (Rashbehari).

All India Trinamool Congress candidate Subrata Bakshi won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 431715 votes. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Tathagata Roy stood second with total 295376 votes. He lost by 136339 votes.

All India Trinamool Congress candidate Mamata Banerjee won and became MP from this seat. She secured total 576045 votes. Communist Party Of India (marxist)

candidate Rabin Deb stood second with total 356474 votes. He lost by 219571 votes.

• TMC is historically strongest in this constituency and must be backed. Muslim turn out must be ensured.

19. KOLKATA UTTAR



(Chowrangee, Entally, Beleghata, Jorasanko, Shyampukur,, Kashipur-Belgachia) 100% Urban constituency

- SC voters at KOLKATA UTTAR parliament seat is approximately 69,303 which is around 4.8% as per 2011 Census.
- MUSLIM voters at KOLKATA UTTAR parliament seat is approximately 307,034 which is around 21.3% as per voter list analysis

In 2019, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Bandyopadhyay Sudip won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 474891 votes. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Rahul (biswajit) Sinha stood second with total 347796 votes. He lost by 127095 votes. AITC was leading in 5 assembly segments (Chowrangee, Entally, Beleghata, Maniktala and Kashipur-Belgachia) and BJP was leading in 2 assembly segments (Jorasanko and Shyampukur).

In 2014, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Sudip Bandyopadhyay won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 343687 votes. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Rahul (biswajit) Sinha stood second with total 247461 votes. He lost by 96226 votes. AITC was leading in 5 assembly segments (Entally, Beleghata, Shyampukur, Maniktala and Kashipur-Belgachia), BJP was leading in 1 assembly segment (Chowringhee).

Analysis:

The seat is traditionally a TMC stronghold, as TMC had comfortable margins in every assembly segments too, in both 2019 and 2021. However, BJP will put up a strong fight here, as some pockets in this constituency are BJP strongholds as well. The turn out of Muslims need to increase. TMC is the strongest option here.

20. KRISHNANAGAR



Tehatta, Palashipara, Kaliganj, Nakashipara, Chapra, Krishnanagar Uttar, Krishnanagar Dakshin

- MUSLIM voters at KRISHNANAGAR parliament seat is approximately 590,492 which is around 36.3% as per voter list analysis

In 2019, . All India Trinamool Congress candidate Mahua Moitra won and became MP from this seat. She secured total 614872 votes. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Kalyan Chaubey stood second with total 551654 votes. He lost by 63218 votes. Intaj Ali Shah of Indian National Congress got 38305 (2.8%) votes and Khodabox Shaikh Socialist Unity Centre Of India (communist) got 8112 (0.59%) votes. was leading in 4 assembly segments (Palashipara , Kaliganj , Nakashipara and Chapra) and BJP was leading in 3 assembly segments (Tehatta , Krishnanagar Uttar and Krishnanagar Dakshin)

All India Trinamool Congress candidate Tapas Paul won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 438789 votes. Communist Party Of India (marxist) candidate Jha Shantanu stood second with total 367534 votes. He lost by 71255 votes. Satya Brata Mookherjee of Bharatiya Janata Party got 329387 (22.3%) votes. AITC

was leading in 5 assembly segments (Tehatta, Kaliganj, Nakashipara, Chapra and Krishnanagar Dakshin), BJP was leading in 1 assembly segment (Krishnanagar Uttar) and CPM was leading in 1 assembly segment (Palashipara).

All India Trinamool Congress candidate Tapas Paul won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 443679 votes. Communist Party Of India (marxist) candidate Jyotirmoyee Sikdar stood second with total 366293 votes. She lost by 77386 votes. Satya Brata Mookherjee of Bharatiya Janata Party got 175283 (14.33%) votes.

Analysis:

This seat is overall a TMC stronghold. BJP however, since 2014 had put up a strong fight. In 2014, the fight was almost tripartite between TMC-BJPCPM. In 2019, almost 20% of vote of the Left shifted to BJP. However, TMC candidate won by more than 65,000 margin. The splitting of Muslim votes should be consciously avoided (between INC and TMC). The Panchayat Elections show a significant shift back of the Left votes from BJP especially in Tehatta and Chapra. However, TMC still is the strongest opposition till now.

21. MALDA DAKSHIN



(Manikchak, Englishbazar, Mothabari, Sujapur, Baishnab Nagar, Farakka Samserganj)

- Rural voters at MALDAHA DAKSHIN parliament seat is approximately 1,054,200 which is around 67%
- Urban voters at MALDAHA DAKSHIN parliament seat is approximately 519,233 which is around 33%

Md Moazzem Hossain of All India Trinamool Congress got 351353 (27.45) votes. BJP was leading in 3 assembly segments (Manikchak , Englishbazar and Baishnab Nagar) and INC was leading in 4 assembly segments (Mothabari , Sujapur , Farakka and Samserganj)

Indian National Congress candidate Abu Hasem Khan Chowdhury won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 380291 votes. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Bisnu Pada Roy stood second with total 216180 votes. He lost by 164111 votes. Abul Hasnat Khan of Communist Party Of India (marxist) got 209480 votes.

Md Moazzem Hossain of All India Trinamool Congress 192632 votes.

Abu Hasem Khan Choudhury won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 443377 votes. Communist Party Of India (marxist) candidate Abdur Razzaque stood second with total 307097 votes. He lost by 136280 vote.

• INC is historically the strongest party in this constituency and is the obvious option to be supported. Muslim vote is very high in this constituency but it gets split between INC, TMC and CPM. It should concentrate behind INC.

22. MALDA UTTAR



(Habibpur (ST), Gazole (SC), Chanchal, Harischandrapur Malatipur Ratua Maldaha (SC)

In 2019, Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Khagen Murmu won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 509524 votes. All India Trinamool Congress candidate Mausam Noor stood second with total 425236 votes. She lost by 84288 votes. Isha Khan Choudhury of Indian National Congress got 305270 (22.52%) votes. AITC was leading in 2 assembly segments (Harischandrapur and Ratua), BJP was leading in 3 assembly segments (Habibpur (ST), Gazole (SC) and Maldaha (SC)) and INC was leading in 2 assembly segments (Chanchal and Malatipur).

In 2014, Maldaha Uttar parliamentary constituency had total 1425428 electors. Total number of valid vote was 1162985. Indian National Congress. candidate Mausam Noor won and became MP from this seat. She secured total 388609 votes. Com-

munist Party Of India (marxist) candidate Khagen Murmu stood second with total 322904 votes. He lost by 65705 votes. CPM was leading in 2 assembly segments (Habibpur (ST) and Gazole (SC)) and INC was leading in 5 assembly segments (Chanchal, Harischandrapur, Malatipur, Ratua and Maldaha (SC)

Indian National Congress candidate Mausam Noor won and became MP from this seat. She secured total 440264 votes. Communist Party Of India (marxist) candidate Sailen Sarkar stood second with total 380123 votes. He lost by 60141 votes.

In 2021 Assembly elections, BJP won in 3 (Habibpur, gazole, Malda) AITC won in rest four.

• INC is historically the strongest party. In 2019, the votes got divided between INC and TMC and thereby BJP won taking advantage of the major split. However, careful consolidation behind one party (preferably INC) can ensure an easy win.

AITC was leading in 7 assembly segments (Patharpratima , Kakdwip , Sagar , Kulpi , Raidighi , Mandirbazar (SC) and Magrahat paschim)

All India Trinamool Congress candidate Choudhury Mohan Jatua won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 630262 votes. Communist Party Of India (marxist) candidate Rinku Naskar stood second with total 491494 votes. She lost by 138768 votes.

In 2021 assembly election too TMC won all seven constituencies.

• This constituency is a TMC stronghold for last three elections. In 2019, significant

vote of Left (more than 20%) moved to BJP. However, Panchayat results show a return of left votes to their own fold. TMC votes however has remained consistent and they remain the strongest candidate here. Focus should be made on increasing the percentage of Muslim votes in this constituency.

24. MURSHIDABAD

AITC was leading in 6 assembly segments (Bhagabangola , Raninagar , Hariharpara , Domkal , Jalangi and Karimpur) and BJP was leading in 1 assembly segment (Murshidabad)

Communist Party Of India (marxist) candidate Badaruddoza Khan won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 426947 votes. Indian National Congress candidate Abdul Mannan Hossain stood second with total 408494 votes. He lost by

18453 votes.

• In this constituency, BJP is not a threat. Congress won in 2009, Left won in 2014 and TMC won in 2019. If there is a consensus candidate from Left/ Congress, then that is an easy winner here. If TMC fights separately, it can divide muslim votes, but given the panchayat election results, the left has regained grounds so has congress. Either a grounded leader from Congress or strong leader from Left can actually pull more goals.

AITC was leading in 3 assembly segments (Islampur, Goalpokhar and Chakulia) and BJP was leading in 4 assembly segments (Karandighi, Hemtabad (SC), Kaliaganj (SC) and Raiganj).

In 2014, Communist Party Of India (marxist) candidate Md Salim won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 317515 votes. Indian National Congress candidate Deepa Dasmunsi stood second with total 315881 votes. She lost by 1634 votes.

Nimu Bhowmick of Bharatiya Janata Party got 203131 (14.64%) votes. Pabitra Ranjan Dasmunshi (satya) of All India Trinamool Congress got 192698 (13.89) votes. BJP was leading in 1 assembly segment (Islampur), CPM was leading in 4 assembly segments (Chakulia, Karandighi, Hemtabad (SC) and Kaliaganj (SC)) and INC was leading in 2 assembly segments (Goalpokhar and Raiganj)

In 2021 Assembly AITC won Islampur, Goalpokhar Chakulia Karandighi Hemtabad (SC) and BJP won Kaliaganj (SC) and Raiganj.

This constituency is traditionally a Congress stronghold, although Left won it in 2014 and BJP won it in 2019. TMC came second in 2019, although they are not the strongest party here. The Congress had a strong comeback in the panchayat elections of 2023. If a left Congress consensus candidate emerges here, it can have a stronger chance of winning against BJP.

AITC was leading in 1 assembly segment (Nabadwip) and BJP was leading in 6 assembly segments (Santipur, Ranaghat Uttar paschim, Krishnaganj (SC), Ranaghat Uttar Purba (SC), Ranaghat Dakshin (SC) and Chakdaha.

In 2014, All India Trinamool Congress candidate Tapas Mandal won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 590451 votes. Communist Party Of India (marxist) candidate Archana Biswas stood second with total 388684 votes. She lost by 201767 votes. Supravat Biswas of Bharatiya Janata Party got 233670 (14.58%) votes.

In 2021, TMC won Nabadwip while BJP won rest six.

This constituency is one of the few that has ideologically turned BJP. Although the Left has regained grounds in pockets in the Panchayat elections, BJP remains strong. BJP also won almost all the assembly segments in 2021. TMC is the strongest opposition party.

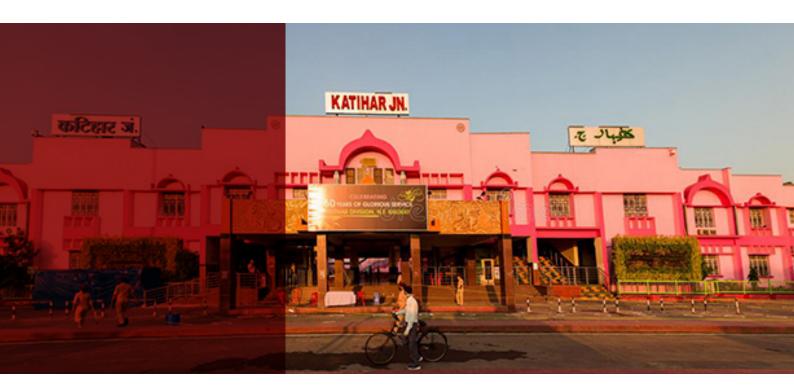

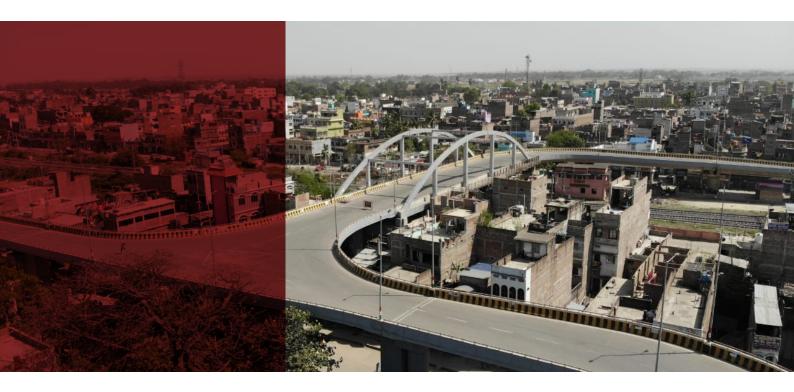

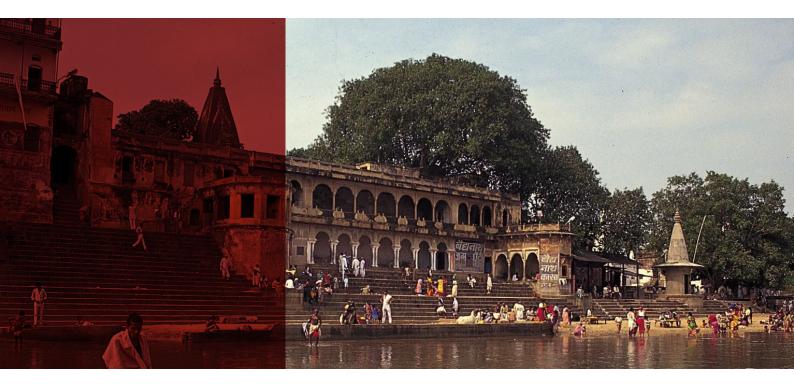

Farmer suicide- In 10 months, 2,366 farmers died by suicide in Maharashtra- Dec 2023. Amravati and Aurangabad regions together account for around 75% of the 1,875 farmer suicides in Maharashtra between January and August this year, according to data compiled by the state relief and rehabilitation department. Amravati saw the highest number of farmer suicides in both 2022 (725) and 2021 (662). Nashik third with 252 this year and 201 in 2021.

A 44-year-old farmer died by suicide at the site of a protest, being held in connection with a dam, in Maharashtra's Amravati district. Farmers are demanding proper compensation for their land acquired for the Upper Wardha dam project.

Poor price for the produce, stress and family responsibilities, government apathy, poor irrigation, high debt burden, corruption in subsidies and crop failure owing to heavy rain are the main reasons for farmers to end their lives.

Marathwada region, the epicentre of the Maratha quota agitation, are facing a double whammy of lower yields and lower prices for cotton and soyabean — the region's two major kharif crops.

Farmers of both Marathwada and Vidarbha regions are now staring at economic losses for two consecutive seasons.

The Cotton Association of India (CAI) released its first estimate for the upcoming 2023-24 (October-September) cotton year. The body has pegged the domestic production at 295 lakh bales (each bale having 170 kg of pressed ginned cotton). This, the industry said, is the lowest cotton production the country has seen since 2008-09. In 2022-23, production was recorded at 318 lakh bales.

loss of Kharif and Rabi crops due to natural disasters, farmers not getting adequate income due to uneven crop production, construction of industries to eradicate unemployment, development of urbanization and other issues were not paid attention to.

The BJP's decision to revert to its core OBC vote bank comes at a time when **Maharashtra** is witnessing a polarization between the Maratha and OBC communities over the complex reservation issue. While the OBC communities are with the BJP and the Marathas are with the Congress.

imbalanced Regional Development Issues of Maharashtra

There are certain issues pertaining to laying new railway lines, defining forest land and awarding compensation to minerals extracted from land, among others. These are outside the purview of the state government and it would be wrong to blame the state government. It is the central government that has a larger share in keeping the region backward,

The water grid is still under consideration and I cannot comment on it presently. But, water is one of the issues that need to be addressed so that the agrarian community is uplifted, water resources in Vidarbha and Marathwada

The gross district domestic product of the five districts that form Amravati region (Rs 51,947 crore), a part of backward Vidarbha, was Maharashtra's lowest in 2013-14.

Vidarbha- 11 districts across two regions – Amravati (Buldhana, Akola, Washim, Amravati and Yavatmal districts) and Nagpur (Wardha, Nagpur, Bhandara, Gondia, Chandrapur and Gadchiroli)

Vidarbha is largely agrarian, with cotton, jowar, soybean and pulses its main farm output. Yavatmal, Gadchiroli and Chandrapur are among India's most backward districts, large swathes of areas riven by Maoist insurgency.

Many regions in the state are prone to drought, and in the upcoming months the water shortage is going to hit many districts before the elections. Water can be an electoral issue in many regions of Maharashtra.

Campaign issues and strategy:

Water crisis

Urban- CNG issue for auto drivers, Street vendors Muslim and tribal combination. Bahujan Aghadi candidate can win this seat.

The district has approximately 30 lakh population. Here is the biggest problem for CNG running vehicles. In Vasai taluka, about 16 thousand rickshaws run on CNG. Due to the lack of CNG pumps here, rickshaw pullers here have to go to Mira Road or Thane. The general public is angry with political parties due to lack of basic facilities. Similarly, since there is not a single hawker zone in Vasai Virar, the hawkers are forced to sit on the roadside. Despite repeated complaints by the hawkers, they have not been able to get this facility till now.

The Palghar Lok Sabha seat includes tribal dominated segments like Vikramgadh, Palghar, Dahanu and Vasai (rural). The Vikramgadh assembly segment consists of Jawhar tehsil, considered to be one of the most under-developed tehsils in the region.

About 25 percent of these voters are Hindi speaking. These include people from Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Rajasthan and Gujarat. Voters of Rajasthani and Gujarati origin are mainly businessmen and the majority of voters in Uttar Pradesh and Bihar belong to the working class.

Palghar has traditionally been the seat of BJP and Congress also has its support base here. Bahujan Vikas Aghadi also has a hold at the local level.

In assembly segments, Vikramgarh, a Shiv Sena stronghold, recorded the highest voting percentage among the six assembly constituencies at 62.64 percent. BJP focused the most on Nalasopara assembly constituency, but the turnout was the least here. According to the Election Commission, only 34.83 percent voting took place in this area.

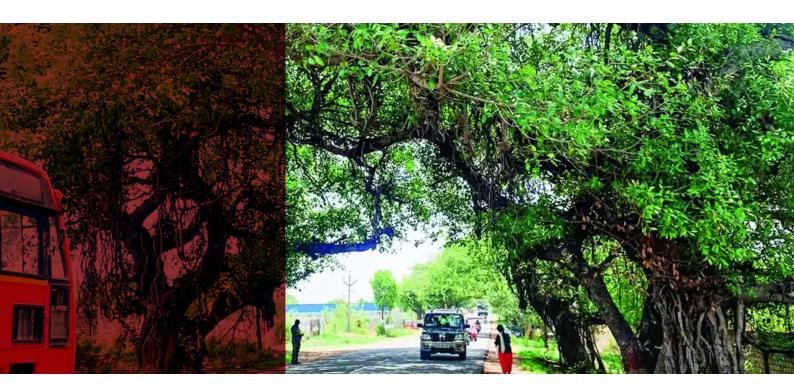

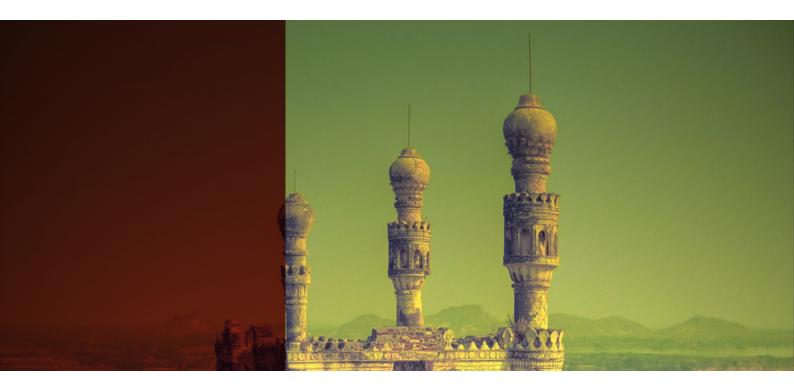

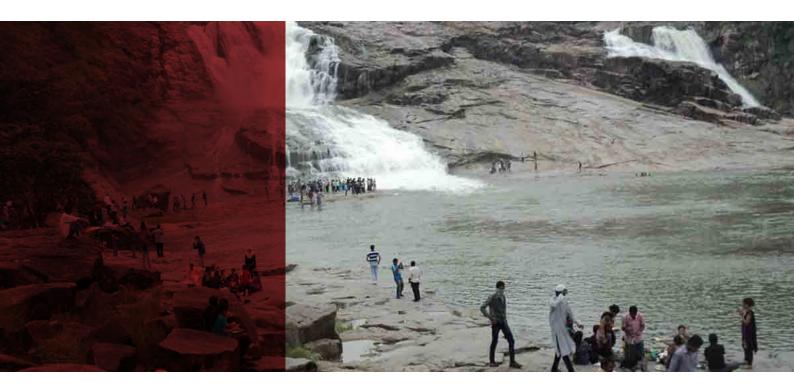

Indian National Congress candidate K Rajashekar Basavaraj Hitnal stood second with a total 548386 votes. He lost by 38397 votes

In 2014, Koppal parliamentary constituency had a total 1535105 electors. Total number of valid votes was 1006508. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate Karadi Sanganna Amarappa won and became MP from this seat. He secured a total of 486383 votes. Indian National Congress candidate Basavaraj Hitnal stood second with a total 453969 votes. He lost by 32414 votes.

2023 Assembly- BJP was leading in 1 assembly segment (Kushtagi), INC was leading in 6 assembly segments (Sindhanur, Maski (ST), Kanakagiri (SC), Yelburga, Koppal and Siruguppa (ST)) and Kalyana Rajya Pragathi Paksha was leading in 1 assembly segment (Gangawati).

• Despite having 20 percent of SC population, this is not a reserved seat.

Karnataka 203

- Though this seat has been won by the BJP in the last three elections, the winning margin has been very low. It was just 3 percent in 2019 and 2014 and around 10 percent in 2009. So this is a constituency where it is not impossible to defeat BJP.
- In a seat which has been won by a very low margin of 3 percent which is almost 38 thousand votes, the division of votes must be avoided. The BSP candidate secured almost 10 thousand votes in 2019 and 2014. Thus an understanding between the BSP and INC could be an important factor.
- There are 20 percent SC, 13 percent Muslims and 13 percent STs. This amounts to 46 percent of total votes. On the other hand, another dominant community in this constituency is the Lingayats. But the other backward castes also form the important vote bank. This region has seen major droughts in the past. So along with caste and religious factors, there is a strong need to focus on the situation of farmers in the constituency.
- The voting percentage has been lower in the constituency from the state average. In 2019, 69 percent of voters came out to vote, while the state average was 71. In 2014 the state average was 67 percent, the voter turnout for this constituency was 64, 3 percent lower.
- NOTA votes- there were more than 10 thousand NOTA votes polled in 2019 and 2014 in this constituency.
- The number of new voters increased 1.7 lakhs in 2019 from 2014.
- 2023 assembly elections- INC secured 48 percent votes, while the BJP secured 35 and JDS secured 7 percent votes. There is a need to translate this in the Lok Sabha also.
