Conclusion

Since 2014, the main problem in this constituency is the division of votes between AAP and Congress. While AAP came second in 2014, Congress came second in 2019. This division also consolidates votes behind BJP, as voters apprehend the defeat of opposition candidates owing to division of votes. If the I.N.D.I.A alliance manages to field a consolidated candidate then there is a chance to defeat BJP. So far, Congress seems to be a preferred choice for Loksabha in this constituency. The Muslim votes need to consolidate behind one candidate and not get split.

BJP was leading in 9 assembly segments (Burari , Timarpur , Seemapuri(SC) , Rohtas Nagar , Ghonda , Babarpur , Gokalpur(SC) , Mustafabad and Karawal Nagar) and INC was leading in 1 assembly segment (Seelam Pur) .

In 2009, North East Delhi parliamentary constituency had total 1677058 electors. Total number of valid vote was 877904. Indian National Congress candidate Jai Prakash Agarwal won and became MP from this seat. He secured total 518191 votes. Bharatiya Janata Party candidate B L Sharma Prem stood second with total 295948 votes. He lost by 222243 votes.

Conclusion

If the vote divides between Congress and AAP, then there is minimal chances of defeating BJP. The tendency of dividing Muslim votes should be avoided. The number of people from Bihar and UP are high in this constituency, across religion and they determine the outcome of elections. Dalit and Muslim are the two biggest communities in this constituency, which can influence the results.
